MINUTES OF THE MEETING

A. The Meeting with Principal Secretaries of 26 State/UTs who participated through Video conference was held under the Chairmanship of Secretary, Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises on 5th October at 11.00 am at Udyog Bhavan, New Delhi. The agenda of the Video Conference was as follows:

- i. Implementation of the Udyog Aadhaar Memorandum
- ii. Status of the implementation of PMEGP, SFRUTI and ASPIRE
- iii. Review of progress on cluster development
- B. Secretary, in his opening remarks, informed that based on the Hon'ble Prime Minister's suggestion in his 'Mann Ki Baat', on 3.10.2014, to simplify forms to enable ease of registration of MSME's, Ministry has notified a simple one-page registration Form 'Udyog Aadhaar Memorandum(UAM)' on 18th September, 2015 in the Gazette of India Vide Notification Number S.O 2576 (E). He elucidated the salient features of the Udyog Aadhaar Memorandum and said that it is simple, easy and web-enabled. The UAM provides hassle- free instant registration of MSMEs after filing a one-page online form. He requested State/UTs to issue instructions for effective implementation of the UAM. State-wise issues raised during the VC and the remarks of the Ministry are as follows:

In order to promote ease of doing business for MSMEs, it has been decided to seek lesser information than EM-I/II in the UAM. Further, the information sought is on self-certification basis and no supporting documents are required at the time of online filing of UAM.			
9.	What would be the role of "Udyog Bandhu" in the UAM?	The role of facilitating the creation and growth of enterprises in the States/UTs is not proposed to change in any manner whatsoever through UAM. The concept of "Udyog Bandhu" may therefore not be affected by UAM.

A cut-off date may be decided for stopping EM-I/II filing and adopting UAM	It was clarified that once the UAM has been notified dated 18-09-15, there cannot be a different cut-off date announced for adopting UAM. 13.	What would happen to those enterprises which do not have Aadhaar.	At present Aadhaar Number is mandatory for registration under UAM. However, the GoI will find a way out for covering those cases where Aadhaar Number is not available.

NIC is in the process of creating provision in the UAM Portal whereby GM DICs shall be able to enter their remarks on the respective information provided by the entrepreneurs while filing the UAM online.

19.	Whether the new system of registration provides NIC Code in Hindi and English	Presently the NIC Codes are only available in English. However, the same may be made available in Hindi in due course.		
20.	Whether the EM-I and EM-II replaced by UAM	This was also addressed at point number 1.		
21.	There should be facility of data sharing in the new UAM	This was addressed at point number 18.

22.	Possibility of monitoring	Since the UAM is being filing on self certification basis and the UAN is generated instantly, there cannot be any monitoring of the registration process. However, the enterprises filing the UAM online are liable to provide documentary proof of information provided in the UAM, wherever necessary, to the Central Government, State Government or such person as may be authorized.

(ii) Status of the implementation of PMEGP, SFRUTI and ASPIRE

Joint Secretary (ARI) briefed about the schemes of PMEGP, SFURTI and ASPIRE. Several States raised the concern about reduction of targets under PMEGP Scheme in the current year. It was informed that such reduction had to be made in conformity to the reduction of the overall budget allocation of the Ministry in 2015-16. However, the same will be consulted with Ministry of Finance, GOI. It was advised to the States/UTs to continue accepting the proposals under PMEGP. Tamilnadu suggested for a mid-year review of PMEGP Scheme.

The SFURTI Scheme has been revamped wherein the project fund has been enhanced from Rs. 1 crore to Rs. 8 crore per cluster depending upon the number of artisans. 26 Propposals from 1 States worth Rs. 41 crore under the Scheme received through KVIC and Coir Board have been approved.

All the States/UTs were advised to utilize the Scheme of ASPIRE for setting up livelihood Business Incubators (LBI) and Technology Business Incubators (TBI). Under LBI, 19 proposals from 9 States have been approved on 10-09-2015. A Fund of Funds of Rs 60.00 crore has been created by SIDBI under the ASPIRE Scheme to provide easier access to start-ups with innovative products, processes.

(iii) Review of Progress of Cluster Development Programme

Several States raised the pendency of proposals in the o/o DC(MSME) for approval and also release of funds even though SIDBI has cleared the appraisal reports with regard to the Cluster Development Programme (CDP). It was assured that the proposals may be considered and cleared expeditiously. It was also informed that some States were released the grants under the CDP and the pending releases will be looked into.
